This week I will give you some addition and subtraction word problems. Read them carefully to decide if you need to add or take away. Take care, some of these problems might be 2 step problems.

These word problems are all about the Windrush families.



- 1, The family had 10 oranges in their bag. They ate 5 of them. How many did they have left?
- 2, In the family, there were 3 boys and 4 girls. How many children were there altogether?
- 3, On the ship there were 10 cabins. 6 cabins had people sleeping in them. How many were empty?
- 4, The captain had 6p in one pocket and 3p in another pocket. How much money did he have altogether?
- 5, In the family there were 3 grown-ups and 8 children. How many people were there altogether in the family?



1, The family had 20 oranges in their bag. They ate 5 of them on Monday and 6 more on Tuesday. How many did they have left?

2, There were 33 boys and 24 girls on the ship. How many children were there altogether on the ship?

3, On the ship there were 100 cabins. 60 cabins had people sleeping in them. How many were empty?

4, The captain had 16p in one pocket, 4p in a 2<sup>nd</sup> pocket and 23p in a 3<sup>rd</sup> pocket. How much money did he have altogether?

5, In the family there were 37 grown-ups and 28 children. How many people were there altogether?



1, There were 100 oranges in a crate. The families ate 55 of them on Monday and 36 more on Tuesday. How many did they have left?

2, On the ship there were 44 men, 36 women, 13 boys and 21 girls. How many children were there altogether on the ship?

3, On the ship there were 115 cabins. 64 cabins had people sleeping in them. How many were empty?

4, The captain had 46p in one pocket, 14p in a 2<sup>nd</sup> pocket and £1.08 in a 3<sup>rd</sup> pocket. How much money did he have altogether?

5, On the deck of the ship in the sunshine, there were 107 people. If there were 200 people on the ship altogether, how many were below decks?
