When you next go outside, either in your gardens or for a walk, collect some objects that remind you of spring.

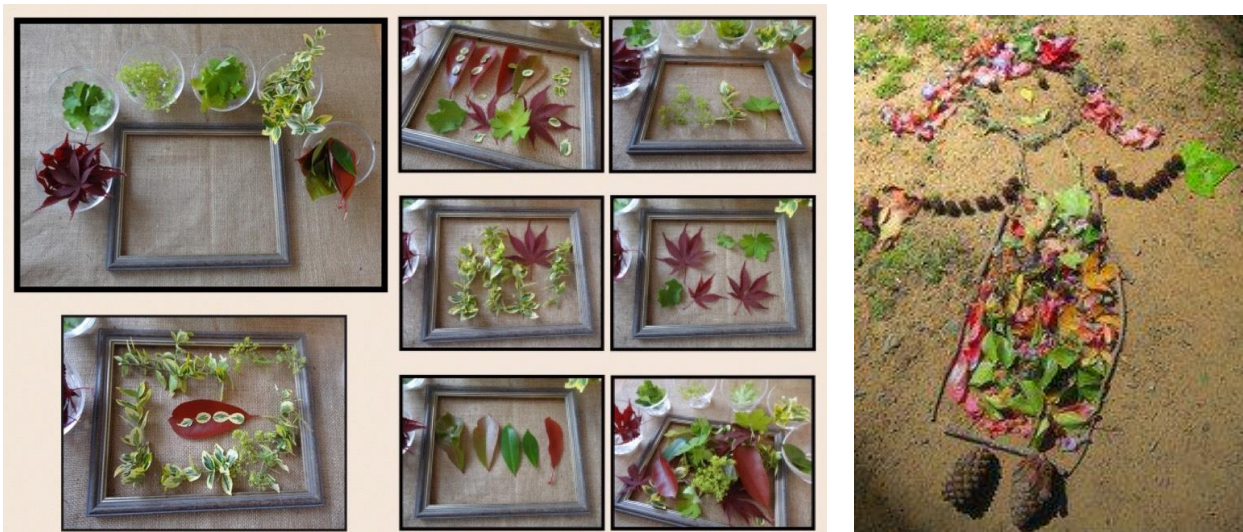
These could be:
