COVID Update



With recent news of a new variant, and rising cases nationally, we will be sending out a weekly update for Grange Infants. I wanted to reassure our families that our daily routines and procedures have not changed and we will continue to follow all Government and Council guidance into the new year.

If you need to visit the school, please can you wear a face covering unless exempt and try to keep any face to face meetings or conversations to a minimum. In school, tables and high-touch areas are cleaned and sanitised regularly. Staff may choose to wear a face covering and we limit any mixing of year group bubbles. All our teaching spaces are well ventilated and hand washing is standard for all staff and children.

Should someone in your household test positive for COVID and this has been confirmed by PCR, we are advising all family members to take an LFD test. A PCR will be needed to confirm all positive LFDs. Some families are choosing to test everyone in the household who is a close contact with a PCR; this is your personal choice. Children who test negative should attend school as normal.
