	EY opened the meeting at 5.30pm and welcomed everyone.

	HT would like to discuss SEN, and this was agreed to be added to the end of the section covering the HT report.
4	HT Written Report
	EY confirmed that no questions had been submitted in advance by governors and asked governors if there were any questions.
	Phase 2 data
	Governor said that in the report it said that 2 children had significant attendance issues. What is happening with these children? In the attendance policy it states that those with persistent absence has an attendance plan is this happening for these children? HT explained that the Home School Link Worker and Sue Forehead monitor absence on a regular basis. This information gets passed to herself, she arranges for letters to be sent to parents inviting them to attend an attendance meeting with her. This meeting is to discuss actions that need to be taken to improve the absence. However, HT explained that she has been finding it difficult to get parents to attend those meetings, but the school is looking at other ways to support with attendance.
	Governor asked why the HT believes that parents don't attend? HT believes it could be that they feel intimidated. A number of the school's parents did not have a positive experience of their own schooling and find it difficult to come into school. For this reason, the school is also going to find other ways to support. For example, one child is at 77% attendance and this is dropping, the parent has cancelled two meetings to discuss the absence. HT explained that she has tried to be approachable and has re worded letters to show more support from the school, but this hasn't worked. HT believes now that absence needs to be monitored weekly. HT assured governors it's not a case that absence is not being monitored but more needs to be done.
	Governor asked with regards to the child at 77% attendance, is this a combination of lateness or not attending? HT explained it is non-attendance. In some case the HT has contacted the Early Help Hub for support and with one child that has persistent absence there is a child protection plan set up. However, SM has been trying to contact Social Care in relation to this but is yet to hear. Governors supported the HT in all she was doing with absence and encouraged keeping a clear record of the contact made with various agencies. HT agreed and said that it is all recorded on the CPOMs system.
	Governor asked if the information on year 1 was targets or predictions? HT explained that the LA ask for predictions from the school at the start of the year. Targets are then agreed as part of the Headteacher performance management and then from this, targets are set for year groups based on entry data and targeted end of key stage.

Governor asked in relation to year 1 currently 5% of children are exceeding. National data shows that 22% of children achieve exceeding at the end of KS1. Is the school looking at opportunities to increase this percentage? HT explained that there is a transition from year R to year 1 and expectations are different. A child could come from early years having exceeded but this is very different once they come to year 1. It is a different curriculum and because this is February data children have not had full exposure to the entire year one curriculum and have not had the opportunity to develop all skills. In previous years the school has had a higher percentage in this area but with the current year 1 cohort, more writing opportunities are needed to improve skills. HT said that greater depth opportunities will be planned in to secure the children having the opportunity to make good or better progress.

Governor asked if the HT is confident the school will reach that 22% at the end of KS1? HT explained that the children are on track, as this has been tracked and evidenced through progress review. Previously Grange's data has been around national and that is what the school is targeting so she is confident the school will reach it again. She reminded governors that it takes time to show fluency.

Governor asked in relation to early years what does working, and beginning mean? HT explained that this is in relation to a windscreen and explained this to governors. Governor asked if you can exceed in early years? HT explained you can.

Governor asked if you take SEN out of the examples on the report how does the data look? HT said that for year 1 and 2 children who are disadvantaged and not SEN are either close to or ARE.

Governors were pleased with this and commented that it looked positive even with the SEN data. Governor asked how likely are the SEN children to reach ARE? HT said that it was difficult to say as it will depend on how the children progress. SM said that JH, JC and herself are due to discuss this in a follow up meeting regarding pupil premium strategy. They will be able to show evidence from starting points.

Governor asked for clarification on the persistent absence percentage. HT explained that the children are at school 82% of time, absent 18%. Governor asked when do children move to persistent absence? HT explained this is when attendance falls below 95% for a set amount of time. Governor asked how many children are considered persistently absence? HT said 4 children. Governor asked with lots of bugs and sickness at the school, has this affected the persistently absent? HT explained that those who are persistently absent are for a number of reasons and it is not always down to illness

Governor said they were surprised that 12 children were off because there was an inset day at the juniors but not at the infants. SM believed it was a group of parents who all had the wrong date. HT explained that this year Infants shared the same inset days as the Juniors apart from one day, and this was because the HT didn't

agree with the date and it didn't work for Grange. Governor suggested sending a text when a situation like this arises again.

Governor asked if there were any further concerns with staff sickness, as this has been discussed previously? HT explained that those who were a concern are no longer. HT held sickness trigger point meetings and since then it has been significantly better. There are some staff who have high sickness due to medical issues which have not been highlighted in the report.

Governor asked if there have been any further exclusions? HT explained she issued a day and a half exclusion today as a child destroyed a classroom and hurt SM intentionally. Governor asked if the exclusions were all the same child? HT said no, the exclusions highlighted centre around 2 children. There had been a further exclusion on the day of the meeting, not reflected in the report. This was due to physical aggression towards a child and adult. The school has been giving the child structured support, but the child is still not coping. Governor asked what are the risks when the child returns? HT explained that it has been agreed with the mum that the child needs to go on a part time timetable. First to start mornings in the classroom, if this is successful increase, if not reduce. SM added that an EHCP has been requested to help support the child when they more to Juniors. Governors supported the HT's decision.

Governor asked with JC moving over to cover Jo Dadd's class, how will this impact on the work JC is currently doing? HT explained that she would now be doing this work. Governor asked if the role of Jo Dadd will be replaced? HT said that this role will be replaced, and HT is due to interview four candidates for the position, to start in September.

Send impact reports to Gov's not at FGB- HT

Governors wanted to thank HT for a comprehensive report showing a positive picture.

SEN

HT said that recently governors received an impact report from English and Maths leads, and now governors can see impact reports from Inclusion. She gave governors a report from SM and Constance Cave. HT explained that it would help governors understand where the school is going and there will be a rolling programme of these reports.

HT explained with the HT written report she has been advised to keep it as a rolling report and to add commentary to the summary. Governors would then be able to use this report as it would show strengths and issues for each year group. Governors agreed this was a good idea and asked the HT to do the same for attendance.

TW explained that she can now access emails via her school account. She also has completed the SFVS with RF who will send out prior to the next FGB for review. She added that if Governors are interested there are briefings being held by Governor Services on the new Ofsted Framework, as well as there are two spaces available for Governors in the summer conference.

TW told the GB that she felt the HT report was very clear and could see that staff were recognising the needs of SEN at an early stage.

EY updated Governors about the Wellbeing working party which consists of her, SM, JC, RF and 2 TAs. A staff survey was sent out on wellbeing to get a benchmark and it focused on strengths and developments of the school. There was a 77% response rate and overall it was a positive picture. EY will give Governors the final report which shows the results in graphs.

HT explained that some of the feedback was staff working out of hours which comes with the job and not having an undisturbed lunch break. Governors and the HT discussed this and said that children get a 1-hour lunch break, but teachers should use this time wisely to set up the classroom for the afternoon and have their lunch. One Governor commented that legally they only have to take a half an hour lunch break.

HT felt that she did spend time ensuring that staff had a good wellbeing and were communicated to well. However, some staff felt they were not involved in some of the decisions that the school makes. Governors felt there will always be an element that staff are not involved in the decision-making process. HT explained that she has taken some of the feedback on board and will be looking at how information is communicated, however not all staff access their school emails. Governors felt it was important that this is accessed as part of their role. HT considered a Governor's idea of getting someone to take minutes, but she felt that this would in turn add pressure onto that person.

EY explained that the next step will be a response back to staff. It has been a useful exercise and the HT thanked the wellbeing working party in running the survey.

HT explained that Chris Cheal English Advisor has been in school. The previous advisor was Hannah Satchel, but HT has dealt with Chris at the Federation and felt he would be more compatible. After his visit he was very positive and said he saw good practices. What he saw in the classroom reflects the results. He will continue to help the school explore spelling. Governors agreed that the triangulation was useful to verify what the GB and the school is thinking.

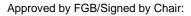
