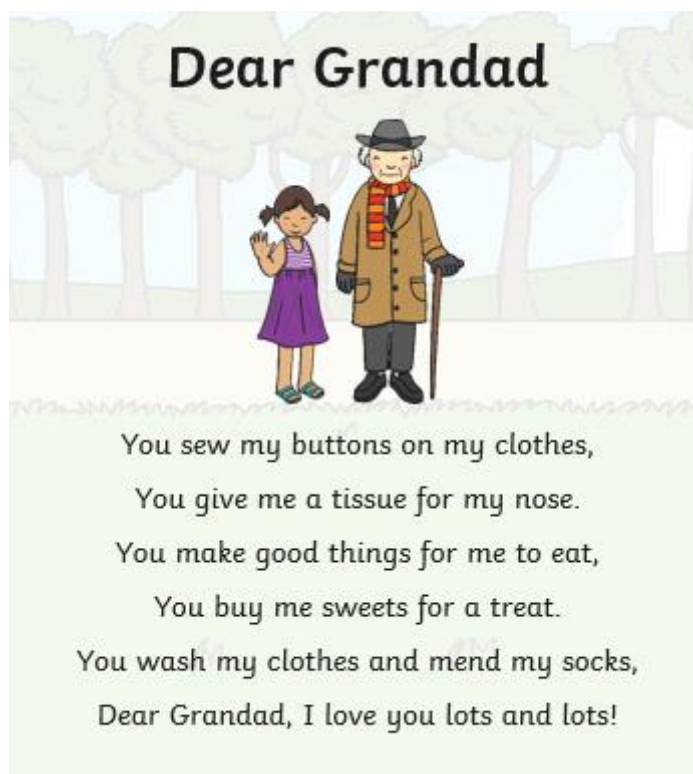


Guided Reading
